

JAN FABRE TEACHING GROUP

GUIDELINES FOR A PERFORMER IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Just like figures such as Stanislavski, Meyerhold, and Grotowski, throughout his career, Jan Fabre has put together a set of 'exercises' which he uses to prepare his performers (his actors and dancers) to work on stage. These 'Guidelines for a performer in the 21st century' have developed into the basis of his teaching and find specific expression in his work.

The series of exercises focuses on systematically refining and optimising the quest for the potential of the physical acting (also known as 'physiological' acting). The exploration of the evocative imagination of the 'body as a whole' is a leitmotif here. In exercises with titles such as 'the old man', 'the tiger', 'the insect', or 'rice paper/fire', it's neither the imitation nor the psychological aspect which takes centre stage, but the exploration of the physical potential of the transforming body. Here, Fabre attaches great importance to breathing, the use of explosive energy, and the articulations of head, torso, and limbs. A lot of input is drawn from the kinetics of cold and warm-blooded animals.

JAN FABRE TEACHING GROUP AT TEATRO OUT OFF

For a few years now, Jan Fabre has also been training some of his most experienced performers (Cédric Charron, Annabelle Chambon, Ivana Jozić, Pietro Quadrino, Stella Höttler and others) to teach these 'guidelines'.

In workshops and masterclasses lasting several days, the performer's body becomes an instrument which examines and embodies the transition from act to acting. The imagination and physical awareness are gradually sharpened and the performer is challenged to build a bridge towards a state of physical transformation.

At the occasion of the performances of PEAK MYTIKAS (On The Top Of Mount Olympus), an 8 hour - performance in which eleven multi-talented performers (actors, dancers, and musicians) join Jan Fabre in the creation of a 8-hour-long mythological rave, Teatro Out Off organizes a **Jan Fabre Teaching Group from Monday 6 to Thursday 9 November.**

FROM ACT TO ACTING

The contemporary performer unites performance, theatre, and dance. Fabre always looks for physical impulses in and on the bodies of his performers and stimulates them to act on stage on the basis of those 'real' physical sensations. Fabre uses the expression 'from act to acting' to describe that process: the real physical impact (tension, pain stimulus, exhaustion, etc.) becomes part of what happens on stage. The physiological processes in the actor's body radiate in the hall, as it were, so that the pain, tension, and exhaustion also affect the audience.

Cédric Charron

Cédric Charron was born in Bretagne, France. He first completed his MA economics and politics sciences in Rennes, and integrated in 1997 P.A.R.T.S /Brussels to study performance and dance.

Cédric Charron first joined Troubleyn/Jan Fabre in 1999, with the production 'As Long As The World Needs a Warrior's Soul'. Later he also performed other of Fabre's works such as 'Je suis sang' (2001), 'Tannhäuser' (2004), 'The Crying Body' (2004), 'History of Tears' (2005), 'Orgy of Tolerance' (2009) and 'Prometheus landscape II' (2011), 'Tragedy of a friendship' (2013). He also collaborated on 'Preparatio Mortis', a solo for Annabelle Chambon and dances in Pierre Coulibeuf's film Les Guerriers de la beauté. Cédric Charron was also part of Jan Fabre's 24-hour project 'Mount Olympus. To glorify the cult of tragedy' (2015) and 'Belgium Rules/ Belgian Rules' (2017) which toured internationally for many years.

More recently he has performed in the 'The Fluid Force of Love' (2021). In 2014 Jan Fabre, inspired by the life of Cédric Charron, created the solo work 'Attends Attends, pour mon père' for and with Charron. Since its incention, he has been a part of the Jan Fabre Teaching Group, training
